FROM THE MANAGER



Important News for Kayakers: We have run out of space for waterfront storage of canoes & kayaks. Many unidentified craft, have turned up at the waterfront — too many for the space available. To regain control of the situation, we have begun to assess an annual fee for storing canoes & kayaks at the waterfront. All known owners will be notified of the new fee to enable each to chose where/how to store their watercraft. As always, unidentified craft will, after 18 months, be considered Club property. In sum, all trailers, canoes, and kayaks must be identified with CRYCC stickers, available at the Pro Shop.

If you would like to be included in this process, just let me know. Waterfront Trailer Parking. All boaters are requested to show courtesy by allowing space for others to use the ramp and boat lift. Please follow the directions on the signage, and park your rig so as not to interfere with other members' vehicles or boats. Please remember to re-lock the ramp gate when you depart.

Canoes, kayaks and paddleboards are available free for all club members. The craft you see stored at the waterfront are there for you. We have only a few paddles, and I prefer to bring my own, just as I also wear my own life jacket. Owners not wishing to volunteer their equipment for all members' use may simply padlock their boat. If it's not locked, feel free to use the craft, and be so kind as to clean and replace the kayak/canoe/paddleboard when you finish.

<u>Would you like to learn to sail</u>? Simply contact me or any member of our Bridge, to arrange for group or individual lessons or refresher sessions. Club Sunfish and Lasers are available for members checked out by our instructors.

Swim Tests:

All individuals (patrons and guests) under the age of 18 who wish to use the diving board and/or swim in the deep end must take and pass a swim test.

- What to Expect: the test consists of jumping into the pool, treading water for 1 minute, and swimming to the opposite end of the pool without stopping and/or hanging onto the rope/ wall. A record will be kept of those individuals who did/did not pass.
- For individuals who fail their swim tests: these
 individuals will be considered non- swimmers
 and will not be allowed to swim in deep water
 or use deep water features (with or without a
 flotation device). Non- swimmers must stay in
 chest- deep water or less and must be within
 arms reach of an adult 18 years or older.

LIGHTNING FACTS

- Air in a lightning strike can be heated up to 50,000 degrees Fahrenheit.
- Lightning often strikes outside of heavy rain and may occur as far as 10 miles away from any rainfall.
- Most lightning incidents occur when people are caught outdoors in the summer months during the afternoon and evening between 2:00-6:00 p.m.
- A ground strike can produce somewhere between 100 million to one billion volts of electricity.
- The length of a cloud-to-ground lightning strike can range from two miles to 10.

What To Do...?

- Seek Shelter Immediately
- Do not stand under tall trees or sit in a golf cart. Do not stand under a lone tree, even a small one.
- You must get away from your cart and away from your golf clubs quickly.
- · Stay away from water.
- If you are old-school and have metal spikes on, take them off.
- If stranded in the open, go to a low place such as a ravine or valley, or the lowest spot you can find.

CYRCC Lightning Policy

- When lightning is within 10 miles, the Golf Staff will sound a horn and ALL golfers MUST clear the golf course and return to the clubhouse.
- Play CANNOT resume until 30 minutes after the last lightning strike within 10 miles.


