TREASURER'S REPORT

All indicators of the Club's financial health continue to point in the right direction. Our expenses in August were in excess of revenue, but given the recent uptick (or perhaps more than an uptick) in food costs, this was not entirely unexpected. The clubhouse kitchen strives to provide exceptional quality food to the membership, and this will not change in the face of higher costs. On a more positive note, the year-to-date expense of the food and bar is right on budget. We can thank Joe Baker, the House committee and Jerren and her staff for their difficult balancing act between costs and revenues. Please thank them whenever you have a chance.

I am also happy to report that our strong financials have meant that we have not had to make use of our line of credit so far this year. For those not familiar with this, as a relatively standard procedure the Club often reinforces its cash flow from the months of June to December by using its line of credit, which is then repaid at the end of the year. All of our committees and departments are contributing to this positive position.

Finally, it is worth noting that our current firm financial footing is due in no small part to the recent influx of new members. New members often remark about how friendly and welcoming they find the club. It is gratifying to hear from all of the membership that ours is a club that values its members and the positive atmosphere to which we all contribute.

FROM THE PRO - DAN PHILIPPON, PGA

Even though the temperatures are starting to fall, it doesn't mean you have to stop swinging your clubs. The Indoor Teaching Studio, located in the ballroom, will be up again during the winter months. Last year was the first with the studio, and it was a huge success with so many of you coming in to learn how to pay better golf!

Again, we have the **FlightScope Launch Monitor**, **Video Analysis** and coming soon, the **BodiTrak Pressure Mat**, an industry leader in ground reaction force sensing!

Flight Scope is a 3D Doppler radar that tracks the flight of the golf ball and captures the club head in real time as it moves through the hitting area. Here are a few of the Ball and Club factors it reads:

<u>Ball Flight:</u> Speed, Launch Angles, Sidespin & Backspin Rates, Distance and more!



<u>Club Head:</u> Speed, Attack Angle, Path, Face Angle, Dynamic Loft at Impact and more!

As you hit balls standing on the **Bodi-Trak** mat, it makes a recording of your foot pressure against the ground to tell you how your weight is moving throughout your swing. This piece of equipment will become a major factor in understanding how your body should work in the golf swing!

When you combine these systems with video of your swing, you will experience a more rapid learning curve due to the instant feedback of

how your swing action creates ball flight. I can't wait to get started!!




