PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

September is planning month at CRYCC. All departments are reviewing capital and budget plans and needs for our Club which will result in an annual budget and capital spending plan for 2023. You will hear more about these plans as we approach our annual stockholders meeting held in November.

It is also a great time to take advantage of the late summer and fall events occurring around the Club. In golf, our Fall Classic and JB Open are right around the corner, and sign ups will be occurring for Fall Bocce shortly.

Our pool operation will be enjoying a busy end of season with activities extending through Sept. 11th. On the waterfront, the fall river activities are approaching with river kayaking and sailing a high priority. After numerous attempts and COVID delays, we will be rebuilding our boat ramp during September, thus providing a much-needed improvement to our launching facility.

After a high heat index August season and our usual distressing fairway deterioration, the cooling nights have begun a recovery and course conditions will improve rapidly. Some new approaches will be used on the greens and fairways during the coming growing seasons to help mitigate our summer cycle and improve playing conditions in general. Look for announcements on these as the fall progresses.

In response to the improving facilities and value of club membership, the Board of Directors has approved an increase in our initiation fee effective January 1, 2023. The new initiation fee will be \$3,500, up from \$2,500 during 2022. While we have placed a temporary cap on membership categories at this time, we have nine new members accepted at the August meeting, with a few spaces available at this time.

In the pro shop, Dan is receiving additional new items and your daily golfing needs are always available in the shop. If you need any golf equipment or apparel, ask Dan about his quick available delivery on items not in the shop.

Thanks to all the volunteers who support our club every day. Your input and effort make Chester River Yacht and Country Club a great place to play. Come out and join the fun!



SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

By now I imagine that most of you have seen me running around the golf course. It was certainly an interesting first month on the job. Hopefully, I didn't bring the repressive heat and humidity with me that covered this area for more than a month.

The course seemed to take a beating during these times, especially the fairways. With cooler weather moving in, the course is beginning to respond and recover.

During the summer months of June, July and August, I am sure you have noticed small holes in the greens. This is called venting. Venting is the process of aerification that minimally disrupts the putting surface by using .2" solid needle tines to poke tiny holes. After the venting process the green is rolled. The goal is to vent every 2-3 weeks during the hot months.

Why we vent:

- •Gas exchange is the major goal of venting. Oxygen enters the rootzone and exchanges with carbon dioxide that has built up. This process dramatically cools off the rootzone.
- •Oxygen entering the soil profile helps dry and maintain a firmer putting surface. Water can penetrate the canopy and help evenly distribute moisture.
- •Assists in root development. The healthier and longer the roots, the healthier the grass plant!

As the season moves on, similar processes will ramp up in a larger scale, that will over time help all our playing surfaces to become healthier and firmer.


