

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

CRYCC is celebrating the start of our boating season with our Flag Raising ceremony on May 12th at 5pm at the flag pole on the front lawn. This is an annual event where all members are welcome. This year, we have the good fortune of having a group of Chester River Chorale singers to join us to sing various anthems in addition to the usual pomp and ceremony provided by our own members.





all learned in civics classes, scouting troops, and our military service that the U.S. flag should be properly positioned above all other flags on an individual flag pole. While this is appropriate and proper on a single pole, our flag pole contains a yardarm and gaff, which are typical of flag poles used at Yacht Clubs and other governmental sites where there are navigable waters. You will see these more complex poles at the Naval Academy in Annapolis, for example, and at most yacht clubs nationwide.

Our Club has a rich history dating from 1929 when it was founded as the Chester River Yacht and Country Club. Our flag pole was placed in a prominent position at the front of the Club for all visitors and members to see. The specific orientation of our pole was given significant thought and complies with proper flag etiquette. On a flag pole with a gaff, (the pole extending toward the clubhouse at a 45 degree angle), the position of "highest honor," above all others is the uppermost position on the gaff, separated from all other flags on the common pole. The installation of our pole is positioned so the flag pole represents a ship heading to the sea, with the gaff pointing rearward toward the building. This most honored position is stipulated in governmental guidance for displaying the flag. This pole configuration has been a part of American history since the founding of our Navy.

Sometimes, confusion arises because it appears the club burgee is flying higher than the Stars and Stripes. While the burgee does possess higher elevation on the multi-flag vertical pole, it does not hold the position of highest honor. The highest honor position remains the gaff pole.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Our financial status at the end of March was very solid. Our year-to-date position continues to show positive figures in terms of income over expenses, and the golf course and house activity continue to ramp up.

The finance committee has completed its budget forecast taking into account the inflationary pressures that could not be foreseen when the budget that was set in



October and passed at the November shareholders meeting. The result of this review shows mixed signals. We anticipate greater income potential through a very strong membership number. The regular capital renewal portion of the membership billing and a good forecast regarding initiation fees should be in line to fund our projected capital projects.

On the downside, food costs are up and fuel related costs are almost double what was anticipated six months ago, and that affects everything from greens and grounds maintenance to chemicals and everything that has to come into the Club via a truck. Our forecast suggests that we can end this year on another positive financial footing as long as the finance committee keeps a clear eye on expenses.

By way of a reminder, the latest financials are always available on the website.

Swim Tests:

All individuals (patrons and guests) under the age of 18 who wish to use the diving board and/or swim in the deep end must take and pass a swim test.

 What to Expect: the test consists of jumping into the pool, treading water for 1 minute, and swimming to the opposite end of the pool without stopping and/or hanging onto the rope/ wall. A record will be kept of those individuals who did/did not pass. For individuals who fail their swim tests: these
individuals will be considered non- swimmers
and will not be allowed to swim in deep water
or use deep water features (with or without a
flotation device). Non- swimmers must stay in
chest- deep water or less and must be within
arms reach of an adult 18 years or older.

Pool Programming:

Adult fitness classes will resume this summer beginning Monday, June 20 from 9- 10am! Classes are \$10 and charged to the member's account. We look forward to seeing your participation in the following classes:

- Monday and Friday: Range of Motion
- Tuesday and Thursday: Water Aerobics
- Wednesday and Saturday: Total Body Blast
- Sunday: Open Swim

NEW Adult Lap Swimming: Beginning Monday, June 20, the pool will be open for adult lap swimming. This means the pool will be closed to other patrons during this time! Depending on popularity and usage, these times are subject to change. The lap swim schedule is as follows:

- Monday/Wednesday: 6pm-7pm
- Tuesday/Thursday/Saturday: 8am- 9am
- Sunday: 9-10am

Private Swim Lessons will be offered in 30 minute time slots, Monday - Friday mornings from 10am-12pm, beginning Monday, June 20. Lessons are \$18. In order to reserve a swim lesson slot, a patron must sign up at least 24 hours in advance through Signupgenius. A link to the swim lesson reservation form will be sent out every Sunday morning at 11am. Patrons can sign up for lessons up to 1 week in advance. If your desired swim lesson slot(s) is booked, you can contact the pool to be placed on a waitlist.

Make and Take Wednesdays: Materials for a craft will be available every Wednesday at the front gate. Come get artistic and crafty creating things like squirt gun painting and slime!


Stafford and the team of Judy Sharretts, Donna Moloney and Alice Ritchie, both with scores of 52.




