PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

If you don't like snow and you are looking for a place with unseasonably warm temperatures, look no further than Chester River Yacht and Country Club! We have had a pleasant start to the year, and the golf rounds played during January and February are the highest in memory. Our winter calendar, since our opening in mid-January, has been filled with opportunities. Please check out the fun events available.

Winter season work continues on the golf course with the highlight being the construction of new tees for our shorter courses. As reported previously, we are moving away from gender tees and creating 5 separate course lengths rated for both men and women. The recommended tees to use will be based on the typical length of your driver distance. Selecting the proper course for your distance off the tee will allow all golfers to reach greens in regulation and improve the fun of the game. The rough tee beds are in place and final shaping and leveling will begin as we approach planting season for the sod we will use.

Improvements around the club will begin in March in earnest. Our final phase of the Patio Improvement will begin shortly. Besides the pavers, which will begin at the parking lot entrance near the pool and extend to the end of the current pavers near the cart storage area, we will create a walk level seating area near the bocce courts. Additionally, we will provide ramp access to the dining area and do extensive water control and drainage to prevent water buildup and erosion around the club.





At the Dock Bar, we will be reconfiguring the cooking station to the south end of our space to allow better air flow and smoke control. This realignment will also remove the unsightly view from the street, and relocate the waste storage bins. Our goal is to provide a more pleasant dining experience and put a new face forward to the community.

Schedules are now available for many of the summer activities around the club. There is a very active waterfront schedule this year and plans are underway for the Commodore's Ball which is open to all members, so please come and enjoy. The golf schedule is out with a number of new and enhanced tournaments and a very extensive MISGA schedule for the year. The pool committee is winding up during March with planned exercise classes, swim instruction and events. Please mark your calendars for your favorite event at the club.

All of these activities are planned and coordinated through our many committees. I thank all the committee members who work so hard to create a great experience at our club. If you are interested, volunteer to serve on one of our committees and make a difference. As they say, "get in the game". All are welcome.
